**The Pioneers of Television
(1880 - 1930)**

The challenge was to create a device that could transmit a picture of a scene from one place to another. The first step was to create a device that could capture a scene and convert it into a series of electrical impulses. The next step was to create a device that could receive these impulses and convert them back into a picture.

John Logie Baird was the first to create a working television. He used a mechanical system to capture and transmit a scene. His system was based on the principle of persistence of vision. He used a camera to capture a scene and a series of lenses to project the image onto a screen. The screen was rotated, and the viewer's eye would see a series of still images that would appear to be a moving picture.
